PROJECT TRANSITION ON THE MOVE

Are you ready to move beyond the GED or the high school diploma into a career or into college?

If so **Project Transition** can help you meet your academic and vocational goals. Funded with a grant from the **Franklin H. and Ruth L. Wells Foundation**, **Project Transition** is a unique program that moves OIC students from basic academic studies to college level studies or skilled training.

In **Project Transition** students participate in classroom based instruction and distance education. An important part of

this project is helping students set realistic occupational and educational goals. Our teachers work closely with the students to prepare them to succeed as independent learners in college or as qualified trainees in their chosen vocational field.

Students in **Project Transition** can choose from these courses:

Pre-Clinical Nurse Aide Training— prepares students to enter clinical training.

Pre-Forklift Operator Certification Training— prepares students to pass the forklift certification class offered at HACC.

Pre-Employment Computer Literacy— prepares students to conduct job searches online.

College Prep Placement Studies— prepares students to pass the ACCU-PLACER admissions test at HACC.

Each track is designed to help our students look beyond the GED and high school diploma and find a career or occupation that will lead to self sufficiency.

Classes are held at the OIC main office and at the Capital Area CareerLink.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

OIC understands how important it is to support our students in meeting their goals. One of the ways that OIC is able to support out students is through our scholarship program. Under Project Transition, students who meet attendance requirements are eligible for scholarships.

The scholarships can be used to pay for HACC admission, a \$100 stipend for a credit course at a community college, course fee for forklift operator, or the fees associated with nurse aide clinical training and nurse aide certification.
