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n What is the Adult Diploma Program?

The Adult Diploma Program is a partnership between Tri-County OIC and the Harrisburg School District.

The program uses an independent learning curriculum that leads to a Harrisburg School District diploma. Students must show their understanding of basic foundation skills in reading, writing, and math and then apply these skills to real-life learning tasks called Life Skills.

n Who is eligible?

Anyone who previously attended the Harrisburg School District or currently lives in the Harrisburg School District and is at least 19 years old is eligible. Students cannot be currently enrolled in a Harrisburg School District program.

In addition, students must demonstrate a basic understanding of reading and math as measured by the Test for Adult Basic Education. Refresher classes in reading and math are offered free of charge.

n What will I learn?

Students will demonstrate their understanding of Life Skills in seven areas:

- Community Resources;
- Occupational Knowledge;
- Government, Law, and Citizenship;
- Global Studies;
- Science and Technology;
- Consumer Economics; and
- Health and Self Awareness.

n How is the program structured?

Students work at their own pace to complete the Life Skills curriculum workbook. They meet regularly with assessors to review their progress. Completion time varies by student.

n Where is the program offered?

The program is offered at Tri-County OIC’s main offices at 500 Maclay Street in Harrisburg.

■ How do I get started?

To begin the enrollment process, fill out an application, available at Tri-County OIC or online at www.tricountyoic.org. After we receive your completed application, we will notify you of the next orientation session.
