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n What is Project Move Up?

Project Move Up is a partnership between the Pennsylvania Department of Welfare and the Pennsylvania Department of Education designed to help eligible TANF clients receive the basic education they need to pass the GED test and become proficient in English.

Project Move Up uses a content-specific curriculum in fast-track GED and ESL to teach you the skills you need to get and keep a job.

n Who is eligible for Project Move Up?

Eligibility is determined by your local county assistance office and your local Single Point of Contact (SPOC) program. Potential students must be referred to Project Move Up by their SPOC counselor.

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n What will I learn in Project Move Up?

Fast-track GED students will prepare to take and pass the GED test by studying the five GED test subject areas:

- writing skills;
- social studies;
- science;
- literature; and
- mathematics.

Students who are improving their English skills will focus on these areas:

- speaking and listening;
- reading and writing;
- community concerns;
- family and school matters;
- health literacy; and
- project-based learning.

n Where are Project Move Up classes held?

Classes are held at the First Church of the Brethren, 219 Hummel Street in Harrisburg. These classes are perfect for adult learners.

■ How are Project Move Up classes structured?

Classes are held Monday through Thursday. You will work in large and small groups, and individually. Your teacher will work with you on special group projects that will take you throughout the city. You will have fun practicing your new English language skills.

■ How do I get started?

See your SPOC counselor to determine your eligibility. Your SPOC counselor will help you complete the testing and enrollment process.
